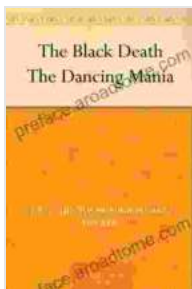


The Black Death: The Plague, the Madness, and the Dance

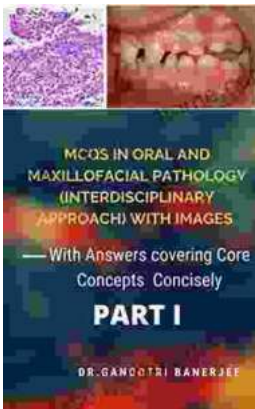

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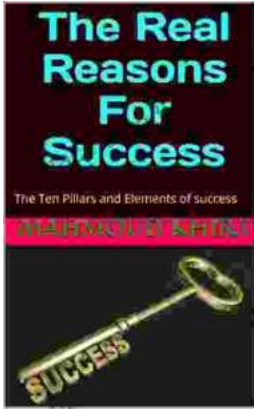
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
